


Why Do Couples Often Look so much Alike?

Houses Built Out of Spite

There is a small tradition of building homes out of malice, intending to irritate rather than comfort. These **Spite Houses** may obstruct light, block access, or can be symbols of defiance. Because occupation is a secondary concern, spite houses are often impractical. Examples:

At the turn of the 20th century, the city of **Alameda**, California, took a large portion of Charles Froling's land to build a street. Froling had planned to build his dream house on the plot of land. To spite the city and an indifferent neighbor, Froling built a house on the land remaining to him. The result was a 10ft/3m deep 54ft/16m long and 20ft/6.1m high strip of a home.

The Montlake Spite House in Seattle (above) is rumored to be the result of a bitter argument between neighbors, where one made such a low offer for a thin strip of land that the owner decided to build a house rather than sell. From the front, the 860sf/80sqm house looks normal-sized. But from the side, it's 55in/140cm at the narrowest.

The **Plum Island Pink House** is a decaying home set in the middle of a Massachusetts salt marsh. The reclusive home was built by a husband for his ex-wife as a condition of their divorce. It's a duplicate of their shared home, just uncomfortably moored in the middle of remote wetlands, built without running water.
